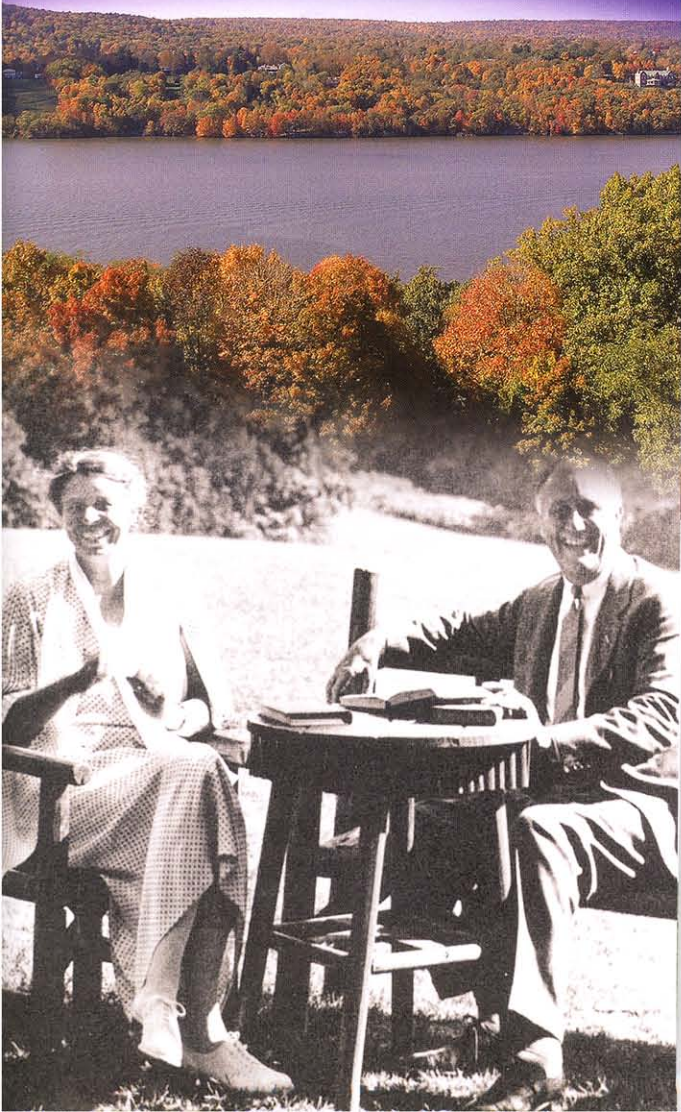

Visiting Hyde Park

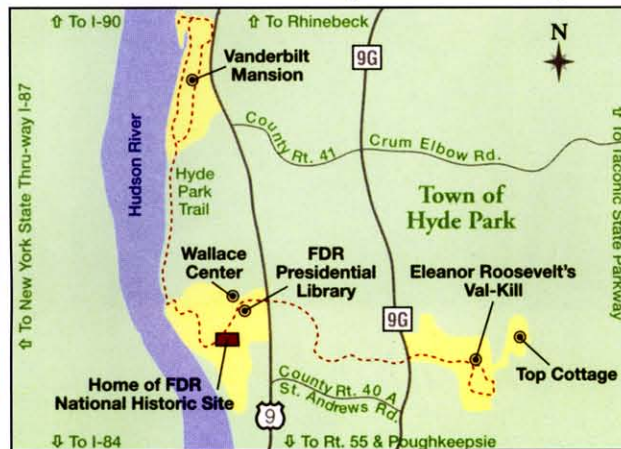

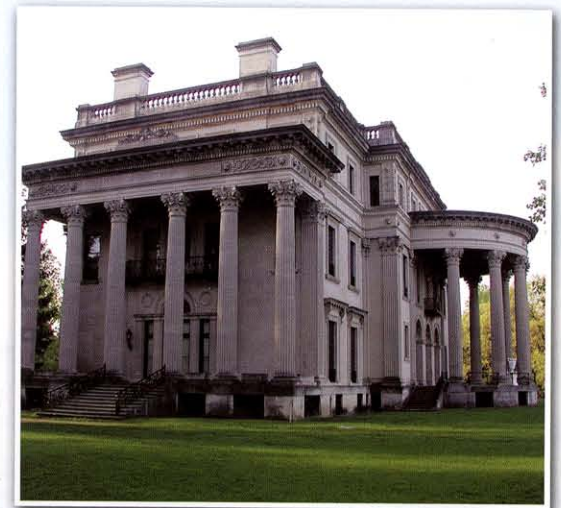
